SINGLE ADULTS & FINANCIAL BARRIERS

1. 2021 Child Care Costs

Median monthly infant fees: \$1,205 Median monthly toddler: \$1,063 Median monthly preschool: \$1,025 (1)





2. Single Parent Income

In 2020, a single parent with one child was earning an income \$2,065 below the deep income poverty threshold.

3. Social Assistance

Single working adults make up the largest population of those using social assistance at 31% and are more likely to live in poverty than the average Canadian. (3)



4. Income Support

Requires considering spousal income. This creates barriers particularly for women who may want to apply but need financial independence from their partner.(4)

5. Labour Force

Two-thirds of women with children under the age of 6 exited the labour force when only making up 41% in February 2020. (5)
